Side Door Ministers (or "SDS"):

(Usually men, but women welcome!) Arrive 20 min. early for the 10 o'clock service, stand outside the side door to welcome and assist persons with walkers or wheelchairs, or to offer an arm to those who are shaky and open that lovely but heavy door. This entrance is increasingly used by families with small children as well. Usually serve once every 8-12 weeks. Also keep an eye out to help anyone who needs help leaving after the service, but rarely have a customer - most go to Adult Class.

Rides to Church: (Another good ministry for men!) We're looking for people to add to the list of those who offer once every 8-12 weeks to be on call for requests for rides to church. The requests come via the church office, Monday through Friday, therefore no last minute surprises. The people who call may be people who normally drive themselves but aren't feeling up to it that week, or people who normally get a ride with someone else who is temporarily out of town, or people who are uneasy about driving themselves if snow or rain is predicted, etc. ***Please contact the church office for more information.***

Transportation Committee: People who volunteer to be part of a group that provides rides to a particular person who needs a ride to church every week. We try to set this up so people aren't called on more than every 6-8 weeks. Groups set their own schedules. We also have a small group that gives rides to Carlton Willard parishioners - one way only, usually the return trip from POE to CW. ***Please contact Alison Taber @ amtaber@verizon.net***

Ice and Snow Ministry:

(Usually men, but women and teens welcome!) Thinking ahead to next year! People who volunteer to help Fred with emergency ice and snow removal when storms come too close to Sunday for him to get the walks and front parking places clear in time (very important to the disabled and those who for health reasons need to park closer.) Friends in Deed: Volunteer to bring a casserole to someone who is sick or injured or just had a baby. Volunteer to give older parishioners occasional rides

to the doctor or dentist. Volunteer to do occasional errands for someone who is ill. So much appreciated - people we bring casseroles to often sign up themselves when they get well! We try to have occasional group events as well - either to bake casseroles or bread or cookies together or just get together for an "appreciation dinner" and eat our own casseroles - we're overdue for one of these!
